LV PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To all players, non-players and stakeholders of Lacrosse Victoria it is my great pleasure to provide you with the Presidents report for 2014.

The 2014 year proved to be both exciting and challenging on a number of fronts for Lacrosse Victoria (LV) and its members, however as a collective we pulled together to deliver an outstanding season. During the year, the Board reaffirmed its commitment to its strategic priorities through to 2017, and embracing the concept of a 'Growth in all policies', adopting a vision to be 'Victoria's fastest growing sport' meaning that every decision we make as a sport must have a positive impact on the growth of the game.

A highlight of 2014 was the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding to be a part of the Craigieburn Hockey/Lacrosse Centre due to open in 2016. This is an exciting prospect for our sport, not only in terms of a world class facility, but the opportunity to introduce lacrosse to a major metropolitan growth corridor.

Unfortunately we were unable to host the 2014 Men's and Women's State League and under 18 Grand Final at Lakeside Stadium, South Melbourne. After much effort and planning, we were simply unable to book the venue, even with 8 months' notice. On a positive note, Chadstone Lacrosse Club did a marvellous job in hosting these games; a great way to finish the season. In addition, the difficulties experienced by LV in sourcing appropriate venues to showcase our game has led to a \$30,000 funding grant from Sport and Recreation Victoria to conduct a facilities development plan. The intention of this work is to guide LV's future decision making in relation to targeted recruitment practices and a home of lacrosse.

In 2014 we witnessed a major win for our game with a 39% in female junior membership rates in the Eastern suburbs. Whilst this is largely due to the hard work of club volunteers, LV made a deliberate policy shift to fixture junior girls and senior women's games to home and away, moving away from the traditional gymkhana style format. The intention of this change was to enable more home games, increase exposure of the women's game and better utilise existing club grounds and facilities. Across the board women's sport is on the rise, there is simply no excuse for lacrosse not to be the next big female sport.

Another notable highlight for 2014 was the hosting of Under 18 Nationals in Bendigo. The Bendigo Lacrosse Club and the Greater City of Bendigo did an outstanding job running the event, with facilities second to none. In addition, we were very fortunate to have the former Victorian Minister of Sport, Hon Damien Drum attend the championship dinner.

On a sadder note, in August 2014 Fred Durham, LV Life Member sadly passed away. Fred was a great contributor to the sport of lacrosse, as a player, administrator and official. He was also one of the founding members of the Eltham Lacrosse Club. On a personal note, Fred was my first lacrosse coach at the age 8; I thank him for introducing me to this great game.

In 2015 ALA will commence work on a National Recruitment Framework in collaboration with the member states. Credit must go to ALA for taking on this mammoth but critical piece work which will see greater alignment in how we do things as a sport.

I would like to acknowledge the outstanding efforts of the LV office led by Rod Kimmitt. We are fortunate to have such a passionate and committed team. Also, a big thank you to all club Presidents for your support over the past 12 months.

A great big thank you must go to the Board of LV, sub-committee members, the Grievance Officer, Commissioners, and the LV tribunal for you commitment to LV.

I would like to acknowledge the significant contributions of our funding partners VicHealth, Sport and Recreation Victoria and Vicsport. These partnerships, along with the support of Local Government are vital to our sport.

Finally, for me personally, 2014 was my last year on the Board and as President of LV. The past 3 years have been both challenging and immensely rewarding, but after 8 years on the Board it is time for new people and fresh ideas. I am forever grateful to all past board members I have had the pleasure working with, special thanks to John Harris (former LV President) for his support and encouragement in me taking on the role in the first place.

I truly believe that lacrosse is on the upward trajectory, and with hard work, strong partnerships and true collaboration, the sport will GROW.

LV GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The 2014 season has again been a challenging one for Lacrosse in Victoria as the sport positions itself to enable long term growth and sustainability in an ever competitive sporting landscape. However, much work has been going on behind the scenes as we deepen our relationships with our partner bodies both within and outside the sport. It is our ability to leverage these relationships that will allow our sport to reach into the new markets that will underpin the future success of lacrosse in Victoria, and allow Lacrosse to achieve our vision and become 'Victoria's fastest growing sport'.

At times this has meant asking clubs to demonstrate a degree of patience or indeed step forward for the betterment of the sport. This willingness to step forward for the betterment of the game was clearly demonstrated by the senior women's teams of Eltham, Caulfield and Chadstone. These teams stepped into the State league competition in an effort to ensure its viability, and in doing so sacrificed potential team success for the greater good of the sport. It is this type of commitment to the game that is required by all to ensure our future and Victorian lacrosse is grateful to the effort of all concerned.

Before reflecting on the season past, I would like to challenge all those reading this report to follow the lead of Eltham, Caulfield and Chadstone and be open to new thinking. Be brave when faced with new opportunities and to be willing to challenge the status quo. Only then will lacrosse be able to capitalise on its rich heritage and firm foundation and take its place amongst more mainstream Australian sport.

Successes

As previously mentioned, 2014 has seen significant effort put into securing the future growth and sustainability of lacrosse. Many of these initiatives will not bear fruit for a few years, however their impacts will be crucial to us achieving our vision.

In May Lacrosse Victoria, Hockey Victoria, Hume City Council and the Stocklands Group signed a Memorandum of Understanding for the development of a purpose built Hockey and Lacrosse facility in Craigieburn. With the pitch coming online in late 2015 (pavilion mid 2016) lacrosse has an opportunity to grow into a previously untapped and growing market.

Our Quickstix entry level program was launched early in 2014 and has in a short space of time become the envy of other State lacrosse associations. Whilst the initial numbers were moderate, the most pleasing aspect of the program was the conversion rate to club membership which is 4 times the national average for an entry level program. Importantly the program has been picked up by at least one local government (Wyndham CC) who are using the program as a foundation for a future lacrosse club.

Our move to a home and away based competition for our women's competition is beginning to bear fruit with a 39% increase in participation of junior girls in the east/north based clubs. A re-introduction of an U11 girl's competition in 2015 should see us build on this growth and set a firm foundation for women's lacrosse moving forward.

Lacrosse Victoria Development Officer Kristen Stone has been diligently working on deepening our partnership with School Sport Victoria (SSV). This work has seen our school competitions reach record figures with 1650 children taking part across 8 events. By tapping into the SSV structures we are able to further expand our reach well beyond our current capacity and grow this sector with a view of lacrosse becoming a sport of choice in Victorian schools.

For the first time, at least in recent history, lacrosse took a National championship to regional Australia with Bendigo hosting the 2014 ALA U/18 National championships. The event was supported by the Victorian Government, City of Greater Bendigo and the Bendigo Lacrosse Association. Whilst not without its challenges, the event clearly demonstrated to government authorities that Lacrosse Victoria was capable of delivering a quality event and importantly took the game into a growing market.

During the later part of the year we engaged VicSport to undertake a comprehensive review into our competition structures to ensure they gave lacrosse the greatest chance of success in the future. A pleasing aspect of the project was that over 40% of the participation base took part in the process clearly demonstrating the passion our members have for the game. The report was tabled to LV Board in January 2015 and highlighted the fact that 'whilst the current Lacrosse structures largely satisfy those who are engaged in the sport, they fail to provide an offering for those wishing to trial the sport or play on a casual basis'. We look forward to utilising the information gathered within the report and implementing its recommendations

On the high performance front our players and teams continue to do Victorian lacrosse proud. Our indoor men's and senior women's teams were crowned national champions. A particular thanks to Greg Mollison for stepping up at the last minute to lead the senior men in very trying circumstances.

We also saw 8 Victorian men represent Australia at the FIL World Championships in Denver. Unfortunately the team was unsuccessful in winning a medal, however maintained the strong tradition of Australian teams punching above their weight and not giving an inch. A special mention also to the 5 ALRA Victoria members who officiated during the tournament.

Challenges

As per my report last year, Victorian and Australian lacrosse continues to face numerous challenges if it is to remain relevant on the Australian sporting landscape.

Growing our participation base must remain our number one focus. To this end the LV Board have determined that our vision for the future is for lacrosse to be 'Victoria's fastest growing sport'. For this to be achieved we need an alignment of focus across the sport and we must be unapologetic in our efforts to broaden our reach into areas previously unexplored, or underutilised markets. No longer can lacrosse exist on a model of recruitment that relies so heavily on family and friends.

Lacrosse has an aging participation base. The recent VicSport review into our competition structures has revealed a worrying trend that has seen the average age of a senior lacrosse participant grow from 28 in 2007 to 31 in 2014. Initiatives must be developed to ensure our game is more attractive and responsive to the needs of our younger players.

Our current business model relies heavily on government funding and membership contributions. This leaves us vulnerable to changes in government policy, which at the stroke of a politician's pen could see us leaning even more heavily on our membership base to fund our sport. It also means that we are beholden to government agencies in the way we spend our money. It is therefore vital that as a sport we change our business model to reduce this reliance and regain control of our destiny. We need to explore new revenue opportunities, flexible participation options and a new membership structure if we are to thrive.

Lacrosse also must address the issue of facility quality and availability if we are to remain in control of our destiny. This was highlighted during the year as we fought to gain access to facilities for our Grand Finals. A special thanks to the Chadstone Lacrosse Club for stepping in at the last minute and hosting this event and displaying our sport in such a positive manner.

The future

As mentioned in the first paragraph of this report a great deal of work has been undertaken in positioning lacrosse for the future, however the work has just begun and must continue. To that end a number of initiatives are already being looked at for 2015.

The most readily noticeable will be a change in office structure with the appointment of a full time Competitions and Communications Officer. This addition will not only improve our administration of all competition related matters it will allow us to implement initiatives to leverage both our internal and external communications. Further, and importantly, it will allow current staff to focus on development opportunities and deepen our relationships with strategic partners.

To address our issues around facility access and quality, with the support of Sport and Recreation Victoria funding, Lacrosse Victoria will be engaging an independent consultant to develop a Strategic Facility Development Plan. This plan, in conjunction with the VicSport Competition Structure Review will ensure lacrosse has both the development plans and capacity to grow our great sport into the future.

As part of our growing partnership with the ALA and member states, the ALA have agreed to sponsor, and fund, the development of a National Participation Framework for Australian lacrosse. Lacrosse Victoria has been asked to drive this project which for the first time will allow Australian lacrosse to take an aligned approach to participation across the country. The project will provide a framework for participation for playing, coaching, officiating and administration, taking a 'cradle to grave' approach and incorporating recreational, competitive and high performance lacrosse.

A focus will remain on growing partnerships with growth corridor councils, exiting local government authorities (LGA's) and School Sport Victoria. This will allow us to take a more targeted approach to recruitment and retention programs. Through this approach we will be able to capitalise on existing structures, utilise our partner networks, deepen the relationships between our clubs and LGA's and more effectively co-ordinate our limited resources for maximum impact.

It should be noted that none of the above can take place without the efforts of a number of dedicated people and organisations without whom our sport simply would not exist.

LV is blessed with a small but dedicated staff who regularly go above and beyond the call of duty to ensure the wheels stay in motion. To Kristen Stone and Maureen Austin a huge note of appreciation.

A special note of thanks to Sandra Hecker who leaves the team after more than 10 years of dedicated, and largely unacknowledged, service. Without Sandra's efforts many of the things we take for granted would simply not have happened. Thank you Sandra.

To Bill Gray and his dedicated Girls Sport Victoria Project team, we thank you and look forward to the fruits of your labour in future years.

To our key funding partners, VicHealth, Sport and Recreation Victoria, Local Governments and VicSport, whose financial and organisational support is vital, a huge note of thanks.

To the LV Board who have provided Victorian lacrosse with direction and leadership over the last 12 months, the sport thanks you.

To the clubs, volunteers, players, coaches, officials, parents and supporters who are the lifeblood of lacrosse, thank you. It is your passion and commitment that keeps the game alive.

I would like to single out the out-going President of Lacrosse Victoria Tim Fry for a special note of thanks. Tim has steered lacrosse through a period of transition and uncertainty. His vision and strong leadership lacrosse have undoubtedly left the sport in a stronger position and his contribution to the sport should not be underestimated.

Finally, and on a personally note, I would like to thank the lacrosse community for their support. Over the last 12 months we have been faced with many challenges and I have many times challenged your thinking, as you have mine. Without your willingness to engage in open and robust conversation we could not have achieved what we have, nor be able to look confidentially towards a future that sees lacrosse achieve its goal of being 'Victoria's fastest growing sport'.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Association Incorporations Act (Victoria) 1981. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specially stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

b. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

c. Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

d. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e. Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

f. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

g. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

i. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

A sub-committee was formed to organise the 2014 State League (SL) first round. Members of the sub-committee were: Russell Crofts, Brett Ruiz, Mark Reader and Marty Boyle. They did a wonderful job considering the event ended up being on a Sunday, not a good money spinner as people that attended left as soon as their game finished and their attendance was not maximised at the bar or shop.

With council support for the U/18 competition in the way of money and facilities, the SL sub-committee with assistance from Lester, myself and lead by Russell also organised this four day event. This event bought in valuable funds to the club, as well a reputation that we can deliver events of this nature, even though there are a limited number of people at the club.

Our season began at the SL First Round against MCC and finished against Eltham. We improved from last year with 2 wins 14 loses, and our team defence has improved. As a team we need to improve our team attack and shoot many more goals.

On a financial note, the balanced sheet reflected that we broke even this year, which is fantastic considering we spent money on the club's honour board, new goals, another set of lacrosse sticks for recruiting purposes, lacrosse equipment, storage at Maiden Gully Shed, freight costs for any purchase of equipment for players. Also to note, there were 5 to 6 players less than last year, which equates to \$1,000 more that the club had to cover this year in subscriptions to Lacrosse Victoria. Furthermore, we still have members that need to finalise their accounts with the club worth approximately \$1,500. It is expected that the majority of this will be paid.

The Junior Competition was split into the Spring Season (Oct, Nov and Dec 2013) and the Summer Season (Feb and Mar 2014). There were approximately 26 participates in the spring comp and 19 in the summer comp. The teams were the Sioux, Cherokee, Cheyenne, and Navajo. They are loosely based on schools: Girton Grammar, St Therese's, St Kilian's, Quarry Hill, Maiden Gully and California Gully. The spring comp 2013 was won by the Sioux against Cherokee and the summer comp 2014 was won by a combined Cheyenne-Cherokee team.

The club has come to the point where we need to recruit children in secondary schools to create and develop a U/14 maybe U/15 competition and provide protective gear such as helmets, gloves as a minimum and then shoulder pads and elbow pads. Work is underway to obtain grants to cover the costs of protective gear.

This season the club applied for two grants and missed out on both. However, it is envisaged that we will apply to four grants in 2015: one council, two state government and one from Holden. I am hoping that we are successful in obtaining at least two grants.

Sponsorship was not as easy as people expected, we missed out on the Bendigo Club sponsorship as well as the Bendigo Bank (again). I suspect we asked for too much in both cases. However, this should not deter us from seeking sponsorship elsewhere.

This year I have undertaken clinics at the following schools: Californian Gully PS, Maiden Gully PS, Epsom PS, White Hills PS, Girton Grammar (Junior and Senior), St Thereses's PS, and St Peters PS. The Bendigo Senior Secondary College entered two teams, a men's and women's, at LV Senior School Competition. Both teams performed very well. The men finished third (from 4) and the women finished fifth (from 8 teams). Unfortunately this year due to a funds shortage, Eaglehawk North PS did not participate in this year's LV Primary School Comp.

The club sponsored Mark Reader and Mason Matheson to undertake Level 1 coaching course in Melbourne. Both successfully completed and are now fully accredited lacrosse coaches. The club will continue to sponsor others if they are interested to enhance their development in lacrosse.

Lester Young and myself are accredited Lacrosse Referees. Lester will not need to sit accreditation for at least the next 3 years because he has regularly officiated games during the year. I will need to get accredited again as I didn't officiate any games this year. The club would love a few others to obtain their ref accreditation.

My sincere thank you goes to the committee: Russell, Mark, Marty, and Lester. Unfortunately Dylan couldn't fulfil his role as Minutes Secretary due to his end of season injury and Brett wasn't able to attend most of the committee meetings due to work commitments in Kerang.

I would like to personally thank Rusty for all of his organisation and work during the year on events such as: Harvey Norman BBQ's, SL First Round and the U/18 Championship.

I would also like to thank Mark "Wookie" Reader for his fantastic dedication to coaching the team.

Finally, I thank all club members (and Le Clercq's mum) that chipped in when asked by the committee for volunteers to help with BBQs, SL First Round, U/18 Championships and everyday activities during training and game days.

It has been a big year and the ups always out weight the downs. Keep it up because the fruits of our labour will be evident in the future.
